Ministers were informed that the British Government had been reviewing the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, with a view to discussing with other Commonwealth Governments its substitution by other arrangements more in conformity with the present state of the Commonwealth. Land 1124/63. H.E. the Governor General was advised to sign Declaration for the acquisition of parts of premises at Nos. 47, 48 & 49 Quad No. 11, Hosta, required for the erection of a new school.

Land 952/64. H.E. the Governor General was advised to sign Declaration for the acquisition of land at Birgibboppe required to be incorporated in the public road.

Land 695/65. H.E. the Governor General was advised to sign Declaration for the acquisition of land ^{at Attard} required in connection with the construction of a children's playground.
