It was agreed that the Director of Civil Aviation be asked to furnish information relating to the use which aircraft of NATO countries in Malta, other than those of Britain and the United States, are making of the facilities mentioned in Memorandum No. 709.

European Agreement on Regulations governing the Movement of persons between Member States of the Council of Europe (Memo. No. 766)

The Cabinet considered Memorandum No. 766 and agreed that Malta should become a party to the Agreement.

Permanent Residence (Memo. No. 501)

The question of foreigners who did not satisfy the minimum income requirements and who were currently being allowed to reside in Malta on a year-to-year basis was to be considered at a later date.
