Cabinet Meeting held at the Auberge d'Angon, Valletta, on Thursday, 5th September, 1968, at 11 am.

Dependents' Allowance to Training College Students (Memo. No. 1112).

(The Administrative Secretary and the Principal Assistant Secretary (Establishments) were in attendance)

Ministers considered

Memorandum No. 1112 which made reference

to the decision taken in Cabinet on the 22nd February, 1966, on the question of the allowance payable to Emergency Teachers on entering the Training College.

The decision under a) in paragraph 2 of the Memorandum clearly referred to Emergency Teachers who, before admission to the Training College, had been married for not less than one year.

Ministers confirmed that their decision under b) in the same paragraph of the Memorandum applied to those Emergency Teachers who were unmarried and who were the sole breadwinners of their family, provided that their families were in receipt of social assistance under the National Assistance Act. It was agreed that the Department concerned should seek authority to cover the payments of any allowances made so far not in accordance with this interpretation.

OPM 318/63. Redundant Services Clerks (Memo. No. 1118)

Ministers considered the proposals made in Memorandum No. 1118 for the absorption of redundant Services Clerks in the Malta Government service. They felt that a percentage, say 10%, of vacancies of clerk/typists should be allotted to ^{redundant} ~~excess~~ Services personnel who would be recruited in the Government service after passing a special selective examination. It was agreed that a fresh approach be made to the Staff Association concerned.
