

MEMORANDUM BY THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE AND  
PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS.

Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Cap. 136)

The attached Declaration by His Excellency the Governor-General refers to the compulsory acquisition of three plots of land at Attard.

Since the said plots of land are permanently required by the Government, it is proposed to acquire them by absolute purchase.

The above land is required by the Government in connection with the extension of tal-Kmand Nursery; it is therefore required for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136).

From the report by the Land Engineer it transpires that the total freehold value of the three plots of land in question amounts to £6,099.10.0.

Honourable Ministers are invited to recommend.

DECLARATION BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I hereby declare that the undermentioned land is required by the competent authority for a public purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisitions (Public Purposes) Ordinance (Chapter 136) and that the acquisition thereof is to be by absolute purchase.

Description of the Land

The following land at Attard:-

1. A plot of land of the area of 516.29 square canes, bounded on the North by Mill Street, on the East partly by a lane and partly by property of the Archiepiscopal Curia and on the West by Government property; it is the property of Mr. Harry C. Craig.

2. A plot of land of the area of 4 Tumoli, 2 Sieghan and 2 Kejliet, including an undivided half of a cistern, bounded on the North by property of the Archiepiscopal Curia, on the South by property of Mr. Philip Camilleri and on the West by Government property; it is the property of Mrs. Maria Camilleri.

3. A plot of land of the area of 4 Tumoli, 3 Sieghan and 4 Kejliet, including a farmhouse and an undivided half of a cistern, bounded on the North by property of Mrs. Maria Camilleri, on the South by property of family De Trafford and on the West by Government property; it is the property of Mr. Philip Camilleri.

The above-mentioned land is shown on a plan marked L.D. 162/67, which may be seen on demand at the Land Office, 29, South Street, Valletta.
